## <u>Candidate's Statement</u>

I qualified as a Fellow of the Chartered Institute in 1999, then spent most of the succeeding years working abroad at the Motion Picture Association (MPA) and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO). Since returning from Switzerland in 2023, I have been able to take advantage of the events organised by the London Branch and would like to contribute to its continuing success.

The hard work of present and retiring members of the London Branch Committee has delivered an outstanding programme of events relevant to practice, law and future policy.

I particularly appreciate events which bring together practitioners, academics and, where relevant, policy-makers. A good example is last November's seminar with King's College on the Arbitration Bill. I also greatly value events which bring us into contact with specific industry sectors, such as the recent seminar with Clyde & Co. on ADR in the aviation industry. I think the Branch is doing well and should maintain its direction.
